When purchasing new items, all uniform tops must be purchased through the Strothoff International School online uniform shop or seconds hand shop. You can buy the bottoms at uniforms shop, but you are not obliged to do so. You can buy the bottoms as the remaining items from other suppliers like GAP, Mark & Spencer, HM, Decathlon ect

You can order your laptop on-line at <u>Mediamarkt</u> or <u>Saturn</u> or walk in the Electronic store. Please be aware that the German keyboard (qwertz) is different that English one (qwerty).

WHERE CAN I FIND THE SCHOOL SUPPLY LISTS FOR EACH GRADE/TEACHER?

The respective principals for the primary school and the upper school send out the supply lists during the summer holidays. They are also available on <u>ManageBac</u>. For parents new to the school, the supply lists will be included in the New Parent Welcome Packet.

WHAT IS THE PROCEDURE FOR DROPPING OFF AND PICKING UP MY CHILDREN FROM SCHOOL?

If you plan to walk into the school with your child, it is best to park in the parking garage, which is located beside the school. The first 30 minutes are free in the garage. Then it is $0.60 \in \text{every half-hour up to a}$ max of $3.50 \in \text{every half-hour up}$

Helpful hints for the garage:

- Drive through the entrance marked "Finfahrt".
- Take a ticket from the automatic ticket dispenser by pushing the button marked "Drucken". Keep the ticket with you when you leave the car, because you must pay before returning to your car.
- Pay at the machine (Kassenautomat) on the ground floor near the stairs. If you want a receipt, push the "Quittung" button after you pay. You have about 15 minutes to drive out after you pay. online use coins, or max. 10 euro bills. the machine will not give back from 50 euro bill.
- Drive to the gate and insert the ticket to open the barrier. Be careful of the narrow openings to drive in and out of the parking garage.

If your car is too big for the garage, you can park on the other side of Frankfurter Strasse or in the Parking lot off Frankfurter Str. to the north of the school.



WHAT IS THE PROCEDURE FOR DROPPING OFF AND PICKING UP MY CHILDREN FROM SCHOOL?

There is also a half circle in front of the school which is the pick-up/drop-off zone. It is ONLY to be used if you want to quickly drop off your child or pick up your child who is already waiting outside. You can pull into this zone to let them in or out of your vehicle.

Please follow these guidelines for using the pick-up/drop off zone:

- Do not enter the zone if there are already 3 cars in the semi-circle. More than 3 cars create a danger to students entering/leaving the school. Please continue to the parking garage beside the school.
- When entering the zone, please only stop briefly on the right side of the semi-circle. Do not stop at all in the left lane. This will create traffic jam until the Frankfurter street.
- Do not park in the zone and run kids inside quickly. It can cause quite a backup of parents trying to drop off kids and that is also where the Strothoff buses pull in and park.



IMPORT PARKING INFO

Other important information for dropping off or picking up your children:

- Please also do NOT park in the handicapped spaces in front of the school (unless you have an official permit) when dropping off or picking up your children.
- It is imperative that the fire department access roac and a path for the school buses are always clear.
- Do not stop on the road. This blocks the flow of traffic and thus puts children in danger, and it creates a traffic jam getting out of the parking garage and into the school from the frankfurter street

WHAT IS THE PROCEDURE FOR DROPPING OFF AND PICKING UP MY CHILDREN FROM SCHOOL?

DOES THE SCHOOL OFFER A BUS SERVICE?

The school offers an optional bus service for students living in the Rhine-Main area. You may choose either the one-way service or the two-way service. The price for this service depends on the destination and is charged once per semester.

WHERE DO STROTHOFF FAMILIES LIVE?


Strothoff International School is one of the best private schools in the <u>Rhine-Main</u> area. Therefore, some students travel long distances to reach the school. This travel is possible because of the great public transportation system in place in Germany. Other students live in one of the communities closes to the school.

Many families choose to live in one of the many communities or neighborhoods near the school. They include <u>Dreieich</u>, especially Sprendlingen (where Strothoff is located), <u>Dreieichenhain</u>, <u>Götzenhain</u>, <u>Neu-Isenburg</u> and <u>Langen</u>

Other good areas are Frankfurt-Sachsenhausen. Rödermark. Heusenstamm. Because of a good motorway system, almost any place one of the that is close to connecting motorways can considered. As the housing market is usually tight in Frankfurt and its nearby surroundings, you may also consider living in a smaller town with good connections to school. You will find international or expat families all around the Frankfurt area. A large part of the school community is German, and these families may choose their homes closest to relatives networks

WHERE DO STROTHOFF FAMILIES LIVE IN FRANKFURT?

Strothoff International School is located south of <u>Frankfurt</u>. If you prefer to live in Frankfurt, then <u>F-Sachsenhausen</u> is a good choice. It's very family-friendly, and you will find plenty of shopping and dining options, as well as playgrounds. It is close to the Main River and its offerings. There are two routes from there to the school, one of which is by motorway. Please visit the <u>public transportation section</u> for additional information. The only drawback to Sachsenhausen is that it can be expensive.

Also, <u>F-Niederrath</u> can be a good option as it is also south of the Main. There are numerous green areas, and it still has an authentic feel to it with many small local shops. It also has a good connection to the motorway.

Other areas in Frankfurt are very attractive as well, but will require you to cross the river and may lead to extra travel time. Popular areas are: In <u>Bornheim</u> and <u>Bockenheim</u> you will find a good mix between interesting cultural offerings and a laid-back kind of living. The <u>East-End</u> (<u>Ostend</u>) has hugely developed during the last few years and is a good place to live for anyone working with the <u>ECB</u>. The <u>West-End</u> is quite upscale, as many people from the financial section tend to live here. The <u>North-End</u> is close to the city centre and, like <u>Bornheim</u> and <u>Bockenheim</u>, it has a nice selection of small shops and restaurants.

WHAT REAL ESTATE AND RELOCATION COMPANIES OPERATE IN THE AREA?

GENERAL MEDICAL INFORMATION



CAN I MAKE AN APPOINTMENT WITH A DOCTOR?

In Germany, there is a free choice of doctors. You do not necessarily need to register with a specific doctor Germany, as most practices will see any patient. But you must take a few points into consideration. Some doctors will only treat private patients. If you do not have private health insurance, make sure that your chosen doctor treats "Alle Kassen" (any type of German health insurance) or describes themselves as a "Kassenarzt". if you are krankenkassen insurance make sure you make your appointment early on as you probably need to wait a long time before getting your appointment.

Please note that for your kids you need a paediatrician, you can't take them to the general practitioner. In most case, that paediatrician needs to be in your town as well, since there is a lack of paediatricians they only take new patients from their own region.

Furthermore, in <u>Hessen</u> you are obliged to do the general visits that are regulated by the state, the so called <u>Uuntersuchnung</u>. Which one your kids needs depends on their ages. U0 starts on the first day the baby is born, U1 before the 10 days of baby live, preferable on the 3rd day and so on.

In these visits, the children are checked on growth, social development & languages development. The vaccinated program is being checked and when needed new once are done or prescribed. You as parent have the possibility to ask question about the development of your child.

GENERAL MEDICAL INFORMATION

HOW CAN I FIND A LOCAL DOCTOR

Here you can find the <u>doctors</u> who are recommended by our school community.

You can find a doctor near you by searching the internet. The following websites may be helpful:

If you have statutory health insurance, you can also search via the directory of the National Association of Statutory Health Insurance Physicians.

Alternatively, the embassy or even your health insurance company can usually provide you with a list of recommended doctors.

If you urgently need an appointment, some surgeries offer walk-in appointments during opening hours (Sprechzeiten). You can simply walk in and wait to be seen, although this may take several hours.

You can also ask neighbours or others living in your community for the best recommendations. Medical experts tend to cater to local communities. Some even do house visits.



WHAT SHOULD I CONSIDER WHEN MAKING AN APPOINTMENT?

You can make an appointment with your doctor on the phone, in person, or sometimes via an internet form. The assistant cannot always be expected to speak English.

In Germany, it is not common for them to ask you details about your condition over the phone. Therefore, you only need to prepare a few simple phrases in German.

Most practices are closed on Wednesday afternoons, weekends and public holidays.

Usually, you will need a referral from a general doctor (<u>Hausarzt</u>) before you can see a specialist (<u>Facharzt</u>). Some private health insurance policies, however, allow you to make appointments directly with a specialist.

HOW ARE MEDICAL SERVICES PAID?

Remember to bring your health insurance card (<u>Gesundheitskarte</u>) to the appointment so that the doctor can bill your insurance company. If you have private health insurance, you may need to pay up front and then be reimbursed by your provider.

HOW ARE VACCINATIONS GIVEN TO CHILDREN IN GERMANY?

<u>Vaccinations</u> for children are usually given by pediatricians. In Germany, there is a vaccination recommendation that is supported by most pediatricians. For more Information, check the following websites:

WHAT OTHER HELPFUL HINTS SHOULD I KNOW?


In Germany, you must go to the pharmacy for most medicines. Often you need a prescription. Low dosages are available over the counter in pharmacies. For example, you don't need a prescription for ibuprofen 400 mg, but you do for 800 mg. Both are only available at the pharmacy. In the supermarket, there are only vitamin preparations or possibly ointments. Have the pharmacy mix any antibiotics before leaving the shop. You will also need to know the child's weight in kg before picking up medicines.

There is no triage in the hospital to prioritize the most urgent patients. Contact your family doctor and ask them to ring ahead to the hospital to explain the situation to the reception to ensure your family member is prioritized.

Children from newborn to age 6 are required by law to see a paediatrician regularly. You will be informed in writing by the Youth Welfare Office (<u>Jugendamt</u>) during the first years of your child's life that you must see a paediatrician within a time window of 2 months around your child's birthday.

Make sure you bring the yellow U-Heft with you when you take your children to the doctor. The U-Heft is documentation for the doctor to fill out, noting the health and developmental results of each U-Examination, so called <u>U-untersuchung</u> (U1, U2, etc.).

Living abroad and moving with kids, means different immunization standards in different countries. Every country has their own rules and recommendations



Reimbursement

To get reimbursement from the health insurance company, you should get a prescription from your family doctor beforehand. Examples are physiotherapy, osteopathy, insoles and others.

For expensive treatments, you should get a cost estimate from the doctor and submit it to the health insurance company before starting the treatment. This is then often approved. This is necessary for orthodontic treatment, shock wave therapy and similar expensive therapies.

SHOPPING



Grocceries is always the first thing you need arriving in a new country. You are used to certain routine, brands, shops and thank you need to find a complete new routine. You will come in shops that isn't your cup of tea, you go once and never again. Others you go on a weekly visit. Personally, I always see it as a big adventure, finding the way towards it and many years later in always think back on my first visit and how excited it was, and now it's part of my routine.

We have listed some of our favourite shops out of the community. All divide into categories.

WHERE CAN I FIND REGIONAL AND ORGANIC FOOD?

Most supermarkets carry some organic products. Look for "Bio". However, most brands in organic shops commit voluntarily to higher standards regarding ingredients or labour conditions.

At the beginning of Spring, you will see little stand pop up everywhere. They will sell asparagus (white gold) from local farms, later on strawberries and other local farm vegetable and fruit. Excellent quality and suitable choose.

Here is a list of some of our favourite places to find fresh or organic food:

Reformhaus

This is a chain store which carries mostly nationally known, certified brands. It carries beauty, care and non-fresh food products. To find a local store, please use the store locator on their website.

This is an organic supermarket that carries most well-known organic brands, and it also has its own brand.

This shop is close to the school and carries dairy, in addition to seasonal fruits and vegetables. There is also a small café.

This is a market hall with 60+ vendors selling a variety of groceries, plus flowers, wine & prepared foods. It is also a nice place to meet friends for a snack or beverage outside. However, it can be crowded at popular times.

Apple Happel

This is a fruit & vegetable farm. You can purchase from the farm shop or pick the produce yourself. There is also a bakery where you can order bread & cakes in advance.

Bauer-Wuerfl

This is a farm which sells strawberries, raspberries & asparagus. They also have several booths in the area. You can find a listing of all their booths, by zip code, on their website.

Schelmenhäuserhof Hofgut

This is a farm which carries asparagus, strawberries, potatoes, onions, & carrots. Located in Frankfurt – Bergen-Enkheim

Bauer lipp

They have a bio-shop with all differ foods. You can pick your own strawberries in stawberries season. Before Halloween you can choose your pumpkins and see the creative stuff they have done with pumpkins. They even had a <u>corn labyrinth</u>.



CAN I SHOP FOR GROCERIES ON SUNDAY?

Grocery stores are closed on Sundays. However, some gas stations have a small grocery section, but it is a bit more expensive than in a regular shop. Train stations in bigger cities have shops that are usually open on Sundays. Most bakeries (bread & a few sweets) are open on Sunday mornings, and konditoreien (mostly sweets) are open a little longer. The most convenient but also most expensive way to shop on Sunday is at Frankfurt Airport. Here all stores are open on Sundays.

DO ANY GROCERY STORES OFFER A DELIVERY SERVICE?

Yes, but since the market segment is developing rapidly, we recommend that you check the Internet for the latest information.

For example, <u>Rewe</u>, <u>Kaufland</u> and <u>Lidl</u> offer a delivery service. <u>Tegut</u> delivers groceries via Amazon Prime.

WHAT CAN I DO IF MY REGULAR DRUGSTORE IS CLOSED?

Drugstores (also called an apotheke) cooperate with other drugstores in their area. There is always one drugstore that has an emergency service (<u>Apothekennotdienst</u>). This information will be displayed at each drugstore.



WHERE CAN I PURCHASE BEAUTY ITEMS?

<u>DM</u> is a chain store with many locations. It sells items such as makeup, hair products, perfume, health/nutrition items and pet items. It also has a photo section to get pictures printed.

<u>Rossman</u> is also a chain that sells beauty, make-up and home products.

<u>Müller</u> has a drugs store department as well as many more.

<u>Douglas</u> is a chain store that carries perfumes, cosmetics and other beauty products. There is a location near the school in <u>Neu-Isenburg Zentrum</u>.

At all of them you can order online as well. Any supermarket will also carry beauty items, but they are not cheap.







Are there admission fees or season passes?

Yes, you can purchase a daily ticket or a season pass at the main entrance of any pool or at the Rathaus. Students get reduced prices. Check the pool's website for details or ask when visiting. As a result of the pandemic, many season pass programs are on hold. Check the websites for more information.

Where can my child(ren) take swimming lessons?

Swimming is part of PE during the entire PYP program at Strothoff International School. In addition, most pools offer swimming courses. Check their websites to sign up for classes. There are good offerings in and around Frankfurt and the courses are mostly held in smaller baths, which are also used for therapeutic purposes. That means courses can be limited, so you may have to search a bit outside the area where you live.

GERMAN RULES



ARE THERE ANY SPECIAL RULES THAT SHOULD BE OBSERVED?

In Germany, certain hours of the day are marked as "quiet," and it is expected that you do not produce any loud noise. Depending on your neighborhood, people can be more sensitive to this rule. For sure, having a loud party after 22:00 can cause the police to appear at your door. This is ruled mostly by the community or state (Bundesland).

In general, the hours between 12:00 and 15:00 are considered a "siesta" time, especially for the elderly. You should also avoid loud noise between 22:00 and 6:00, as well as all day on Sundays. If you live in a 'Kurort', the rules may be stricter as people see these places as somewhere to recover and unwind. Such communities may use the prefix 'bad' before the community's name, which means 'bath' or 'spa'.



HOW IS TRASH PICKED UP IN GERMANY?

In general, trash is separated by paper, glass, organic waste, and packaging. It is collected during different times of the week or bi-weekly. You must use specific bags for some trash, so please check with your local community for specific rules.

Glass is not collected and needs to be thrown into special containers which are located throughout each community.

Batteries & bulbs can be handed in at most supermarkets and drugstores.

Bulky waste can be disposed of in dedicated areas within your community. Please carry evidence of your residency, because you can only use the disposal area that is dedicated to your community.

HOW DOES RECYCLING WORK IN GERMANY?

In Germany, different types of rubbish are collected and recycled separately. The proper sorting of rubbish is a lesson you have to learn.

ARE THERE ANY ETIQUETTE RULES THAT I SHOULD KNOW?

Shoes: Shoes are usually left at the door. If you visit you may want to bring your own warm socks.

Birthdays: Do not congratulate someone ahead of his or her birthday. It is believed to bring bad luck.

New Year: During the New Year, people tend to bring little presents with lucky symbols like a chimney sweeper, clover, ladybug or pig.

Invitations: It is not unusual to be invited for a certain time, especially for kids' birthdays. It is considered polite to arrive quite punctually, although this rule is becoming more flexible. Check with your host if you are uncertain.

It is also usually not a problem to bring other people with you, but please ask or inform the host upfront.

If you are invited for a coffee, especially on Sundays, do come with an appetite because it is common for the host to offer more than one piece of cake. There is usually a selection of two or three types of cake.

When invited to a house-warming party, a traditional gift is bread & salt_as it symbolizes a blessing.

Cleaning the Sidewalk: You may be required to clean the pavement in front of your house (e.g., clear snow in the winter, clear the leaves in the autumn). You may also be required to remove weeds from the crevices. Please check with your landlord about this obligation. Failure to do so may have legal consequences in the event of damage to a third party.



Tipping: In restaurants, it is common to tip the waiter/waitress around 10%. It is also common to tip hairdressers. If you have workers at your house, and you want to show appreciation, you may hand them a few euros or offer them something to drink.

Paying with Cash or Card: Some shops and markets may accept cash only or will only accept cards after spending a certain, minimum amount. Therefore, it is helpful to always carry some cash with you. In many German stores, you are asked if you have a <u>Payback</u> card or <u>Deutschland card</u> or, if not, if you want one. This is a popular discount card (valid for plenty of shops), but you don't need to have it.





WHAT TYPES OF PET INSURANCE ARE NEEDED?

There are two types of pet insurance available in Germany – health insurance and liability insurance.

Pet health insurance is not required but it is a common practice in Germany because the costs for veterinary services can be high.

You must have personal liability insurance for your pet. If you will board your pet, you may also need insurance that includes a dog sitting by a business. This extra insurance can only be found by a few insurance companies, such as <u>AXA</u>, <u>HansMerkur</u>, <u>Tierdirekt</u>, <u>Allianz</u> and many more.



DO I NEED TO REGISTER MY DOG/CAT?

Dogs must be registered at the same place that we are registered as people. The dog must be added as a member living at the same address. You will then receive a tag that the dog must wear, and you will be asked to pay a yearly tax for the dog (the amount varies depending on the dog size, breed and city). It is important to register the dog for you to be protected in case of litigation or if your dog attacks/ is attacked in the streets/woods.

Many cities have a registration and castration obligation for cats. <u>For more information</u>.
